Specific Requirements

As a Physical Therapist in Alaska, you must complete 24 continuing education hours every two years by June 30th of evennumbered years. A Physical Therapist Assistant needs to complete 24 hours also.

You must earn at least half of your CEUs (12) through coursework from approved CEU providers.

R4-24-401. Continuing Competence Requirements for Renewal

- A. Except as provided in subsection (G), a licensed physical therapist shall earn 20 contact hours of continuing competence for each compliance period to be eligible for license renewal.
- B. Except as provided in subsection (G), a certified physical therapist assistant shall earn 10 contact hours of continuing competence for each compliance period to be eligible for certificate renewal.
- 1. The certificate holder shall earn at least six contact hours from Category A continuing competence activities. No more

three of the required contact hours from Category A may be obtained from nonclinical course work...

- C. Qualifying Continuing Education Units ...
- 2. Program content and CEUs accreditation must be approved by the Board or a Board-approved entity. Prior to the renewal due by March 1, 2023 proof of continuing education and a completed "Continuing Education Units" form must be submitted to the Board for approval of a program for CEUs and should be submitted within 60 days after course completion. Proof of CEUs may be 15 copies of the original completion certificate. Beginning January 1, 2023 licensees are required to maintain continuing education and shall only submit such proof if so requested by the Board pursuant to the audit process.

Governor Lamont issued Executive Order 7DD suspending the continuing education requirements for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants. Licensees with expiration dates between March 10, 2020 and February 28, 2021 are not required to complete the continuing education required for license renewal.

Each licensee applying for license renewal shall complete a minimum of 20 hours during the one year period for which the license is being renewed.

3.0 Mandatory Continuing Education Units (CEU's) (24 Del.C. §2607(a)) 13.1 Three CEU's are required for every biennial license renewal for Physical Therapists, Physical Therapist Assistants, and Athletic Trainers. The required CEU's shall be completed no later than January 31 of every odd-numbered year and every 2 years after such date. The required hours shall include 0.2 units of Ethics and proof of current CPR certification by the American Red Cross, American Heart Association, National Safety Council or other agency approved by the Board and posted on the Division of Professional Regulation's website. Proof of current CPR certification will count for 0.1 CEU. 13.1.1 One CEU will be given for every 10 hours of an approved continuing education course. (1 contact hour = .1 CEU).

6706.3 A continuing education credit shall be valid only if it is approved by the Board in accordance with § 6707. 6706.4 To qualify for a license, an applicant for renewal of a license shall:

(a) Have completed four (4) continuing education units or forty (40) credit hours of approved continuing education credit during the two (2) year period immediately preceding the date the license expires, which shall include not more than two (2) continuing education units or twenty (20) credit hours of approved continuing education credits earned through internet courses...

486.109 Continuing education.—

(1) The board shall require licensees to demonstrate their professional competence as a condition of renewal of a license by completing 24 hours of continuing education biennially.

- (1) The Georgia State Board of Physical Therapy requires each licensed physical therapist and physical therapist assistant to participate in thirty (30) clock hours of experience per licensure period which is not to exceed ten (10) credit hours per calendar day. The purpose of this requirement is to assist in assuring safe and effective practices in the provision of physical therapy services to the citizens of Georgia.
- (a) The Board recommends the requirements for competence as planned learning experiences which have content beyond the licensee's present level of knowledge and competence which may be subject to audit by the board.
- (b) Content of the experience must relate to patient care in physical therapy whether the subject is research, treatment, documentation, education, management, or some other content area.
- (c) In the event that a licensee does not meet the continuing competence requirement, the license will not be renewed.
- (2) Effective July 1, 2018, (30) hours of continuing competence per biennium shall include a minimum of four (4) contact hours specifically in Georgia Ethics and Jurisprudence as defined in the Georgia Physical Therapy Act or by passage of the Georgia Ethics and Jurisprudence Examination.
- (a) A Georgia Ethics and Jurisprudence course must be obtained from a Georgia college or university with an accredited physical therapy education program or a provider which holds a current Physical Therapy Association of Georgia (PTAG) Approval Certificate for the course.
- (b) Passage of the Georgia Ethics and Jurisprudence Examination is equivalent to the four (4) hour continuing competence requirement for Georgia Ethics and Jurisprudence provided that the same test result has not been previously submitted to the Board as part of an application for licensure or to satisfy the requirements of an order of the Board.

Sec. 14.1 Continuing education renewal requirements. The Department shall promulgate rules concerning continuing education for persons licensed under this Act that require 40 hours of continuing education per license renewal cycle for a physical therapist and 20 hours of continuing education per license renewal cycle for a physical therapist assistant. In establishing these rules, the Department shall consider education required for the 2 categories of licensees to maintain current knowledge and understanding of their respective scope of practice, professional ethics, and standards of professional associations The Department shall also consider the educational requirements for board certification in physical therapy specialty areas, requirements for advanced clinical or academic degrees related to physical therapy, requirements for attaining advanced skills specific to particular practice environments and patient population, and the educational needs related to special interest groups within the professions. These rules shall assure that licensees are given the opportunity to participate in those programs sponsored by or through their professional associations, hospitals, or employers and which are relevant to their practice. These rules shall also address variances for illness or hardship. Each licensee is responsible for maintaining records of completion of continuing education and shall be prepared to produce the records when requested by the Department. Requirements for physical therapist licensees. Each biennium, each person who is licensed to practice as a physical therapist in this state shall be required to complete a minimum of 40 hours of continuing education approved by the board; a minimum of 30 hours shall be directly and primarily related to the clinical application of physical therapy. b. Requirements for physical therapist assistant licensees. Each biennium, each person who is licensed to practice as a physical therapist assistant in this state shall be required to complete a minimum of 20 hours of continuing education approved by the board; a minimum of 15 hours shall be directly and primarily related to the clinical application of physical therapy. 203.2(2) Requirements of new licensees. Those persons licensed for the first time shall not be required to complete continuing education as a prerequisite for the first renewal of their licenses. (a)(1)(A) As a condition of renewal for each odd-numbered year, each licensed physical therapist, certified physical therapist assistant, or compact privilege holder shall submit, in addition to the annual application for renewal of licensure, certification, or compact privilege, evidence of satisfactory completion within the preceding two-year period of at least 40 contact hours of continuing education for a licensed physical therapist or a physical therapist holding a compact privilege and at least 20 contact hours of continuing education for a certified physical therapist assistant or a physical therapist assistant holding a compact privilege. As a component of the required contact hours, each licensed physical therapist shall be required to successfully complete the physical therapy jurisprudence assessment module specified in paragraph (f)(15) during each continuing education cycle. (B) Evidence of satisfactory completion of a program of continuing education shall not be required to be submitted with the application for renewal of licensure, compact privilege, or certification in even-numbered years. (2) A contact hour shall consist of 60 minutes of activity pertaining to the practice of physical therapy. (3) Meals and breaks shall not be included in the contact hour calculation.

Section 2. (1) A credential holder applying for renewal shall have completed the continued competency requirements established in subsections (2) and (3) of this section during the preceding renewal period. Continued competency shall be based on contact hours awarded. (a) For a physical therapist, the board shall require thirty (30) contact hours as a condition of licensure renewal. These hours shall be obtained as established in subparagraphs 1. through 3. of this paragraph. 1. Two (2) hours shall be awarded for the successful completion of the Jurisprudence Examination per biennium. 2. At least eighteen (18) hours shall be earned from Category 1 as established in subsection (2) of this section. 3. Hours may be earned from Category 2 over ten (10) hours shall not be awarded. (b) For a physical therapist assistant, the board shall require twenty (20) contact hours as a condition of renewal. These hours shall be obtained as established in subparagraphs 1. through 3. of this paragraph. 1. Two (2) hours shall be awarded for the successful completion of the Jurisprudence Examination per biennium. 2. At least ten (10) hours shall be earned from Category 1 as established in subsection (2) of this section. 3. Hours may be earned from Category 2. If hours are earned from Category 2, hours shall be as established in subsection (3) of this section. Hours earned from Category 2 over eight (8) hours shall not be awarded.

§194. BIENNIAL REQUIREMENTS

Unless exempted under §198, licensees shall successfully complete, document and report to the board at least 30 hours of board—approved continuing education courses or activities in the biennial renewal period. No carryover of continuing education hours from one renewal period to another shall be allowed. Continuing education will be granted in the reporting period in which the academic coursework, clinical instruction, tool, residency, or fellowship is completed. The types of approved courses or activities and requirement for each are:

- (1) jurisprudence—a minimum of two contact hours. Passage of the jurisprudence examination, which may be taken online, or attendance at a traditional board-sponsored Jurisprudence course, either of which fulfills the two-hour Jurisprudence requirement;
- (2) ethics or professionalism —a minimum of two contact hours;

The American Physical Therapy Association continuing education courses are automatically approved by the Board.

"MA does not currently have a requirement for CE as a condition of license renewal. It is recommended that all licensees engage in continuing competence."

Hi APTA MA Member,

I am writing to share significant news with you all today. After nearly 20 years on ongoing efforts here in the Commonwealth, continuing education (competency) regulations for physical therapist and physical therapist assistant have been passed by the Board of Allied Health. The language was officially promulgated on April 29th with some additional clarifications regarding implementation having been recently posted. Official language is attached here.

What does this mean?

24 CEU credits will be required during your 24 month renewal period. All credits must be obtained during that 2 year time frame

2 of the 24 credits must be completed in the realm of ethics and jurisprudence

5601.2400 CREDIT APPROVAL.

§Subpart 1. Courses. The board shall automatically grant continuing education credit meeting the standards of part 5601.2500 for educational activities in items A to C as follows:

A. any course planned, sponsored, or cosponsored by an accredited university or college, medical school, state or national medical or osteopathic association, or a national medical specialty society;

B. any course planned, sponsored, or cosponsored by the American Physical Therapy Association or other national or state physical therapy association; and

§C. any course approved by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) for the credit hours awarded by

Conferences and continuing competence activities provided by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA), Mississippi Physical Therapy Association (MPTA), and other state chapters and sections of APTA. Credit is applied as awarded. Certificate of completion is required as evidence of compliance.

- (5) Acceptable continuing education is automatically approved if such course or activity is obtained as follows:
- (A) Courses and activities sponsored/approved by the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) or any of its components including state chapters and specialty sections/boards (i.e., the Missouri Physical Therapy Association (MPTA) or any other professional physical therapy state association); the American Medical Association (AMA), the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), or the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) which at least in part relate to practice of physical therapy.
- 1. A continuing education document from the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA), or any of its components including state chapters and specialty sections/boards; (Missouri Physical Therapy Association (MPTA) or any other professional physical therapy state association); the American Medical Association (AMA), the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT), specifically listing the continuing education course completed by the specified licensee, the date, time, and place of the course, and the actual number of continuing education clock hours accumulated and/or total possible continuing education (CE) clock hours that could be accumulated for the program shall be the document(s) necessary as proof of compliance if audited by the board to submit proof;

Each CE offering adheres to APTA's policies and positions including APTA's Code of Ethics, Standards of Practice for Physical Therapy, and should reflect the language and content of the Guide to Physical Therapist Practice, Second Edition (Phys Ther 2001 81:9-744)

APPROVED EDUCATION PROGRAM. A program for the education and training of physical therapists or physical therapist assistants accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education of the American Physical Therapy Association or by equivalent standards established by the Board.

Phy 406.01 Maintenance of Continuing Competence Requirements.

- (a) Individuals licensed as physical therapists or physical therapist assistants wishing to renew their licenses either fully or conditionally shall maintain continuing competence by completing 24 hours of continuing professional education in each 2-year renewal cycle.
- (b) Individuals who have been licensed within the past 2 years as a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant in another state and wish to renew an initial New Hampshire license that expires in less than the usual 2 years may use continuing education earned outside of the New Hampshire license period of validity but not outside the 2 year renewal cycle towards the requirement in (a) above.
- (c) At least one half of the hours required by (a) above shall relate directly and primarily to the clinical application of physical therapy.
- (d) The balance of the contact hours required by (a) above shall relate to general physical therapy practice, including, but not limited to, supervision and consultation skills, curriculum development, and trans-disciplinary issues or skills.
- (e) Continuing competence shall be maintained through the following continuing professional education courses and professional activities, provided that they meet the definition of continuing professional education in Phy 407.04:
- (1) Receipt of academic instruction in physical therapy, as further described in Phy 406.02;
- (2) Non-academic courses, seminars, conferences and workshops, as further described in Phy 406.03;
- (3) Facility-based physical therapy in-service training, as further described in Phy 406.04;) Formal mentored independent study, as further described in Phy 406.05;
- (5) Direct supervision of physical therapist or physical therapist assistant students during their clinical education, as further described in Phy 406.06;
- (6) Supervision of licensees holding conditional initial licenses, conditionally renewed licenses or conditionally reinstated licenses, as further described in Phy 406.07;
- (7) Publication of writing related to physical therapy, as further described in Phy 406.08;
- (8) Professional presentations relating to physical therapy made to other professionals or the public, as further described in Phy 406.09;
- (9) Participation in a physical therapy research project, as further described in Phy 406.10;
- (10) Participation in the work of professional boards, committees and agencies, as further described in Phy 406.11;
- (11) Completion of distance learning courses, as further described in Phy 406.12;
- (12) Teaching physical therapy, as further described in Phy 406.13;
- (13) Receipt of infection control education, as further described in Phy 406.14;

2. Which organizations qualify as "deemed approved"?

Section 77.10(i)(2) of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education allow the following entities to register for approval to be an approved provider:

- a national organization of jurisdictional boards of physical therapy that promotes and protects the health, safety and welfare of the public and fosters good practice in the physical therapy professions an entity, hospital or health facility defined in Section 2801 External Link Icon of the Public Health Law
- a higher education institution

3. What does a "deemed approved" organization have to do?

Organizations that fall under one of the categories listed above do not have to submit a fee or an application for approval as Approval of Providers and Activities is described in 21 NCAC 48G .0108. The licensee is responsible for determining if a course is approved. In general, any course approved by a Chapter or section of APTA, FSBPT, IACET or a state PT licensure board in the US or Canada is considered approved for points by NCBPTE. If this information is not listed on a course brochure or website, the licensee should call the provider of the continuing education and ask whether the course has been approved. If it has not been approved, the licensee may submit an application for approval to NCBPTE. A licensee should review Rule .0108 for a complete listing of pre-approved providers and view the listing of courses NCBPTE has approved by consulting the Continuing Competence link on the Board website. APTA-NC is also able to approve providers and courses at

All competence activities related to physical therapy sponsored by the APTA, State PT Associations, Medical/Educational institutions or certified by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) are automatically approved as 'certified activities.

- B. To document the required hours, the licensee shall maintain the Continued Competency Activity and Assessment Form that is provided by the board and that shall indicate completion of the following:

For the purpose of this section, "course" means an organized program of study, classroom experience, or similar educational experience that is directly related to the clinical practice of physical therapy and approved or provided by one of the following organizations or any of its components:
- a. The Virginia Physical Therapy Association;
- b. The American Physical Therapy Association...

To renew a physical therapist license, you must have 32 hours of continuing education and 200 hours of physical therapy employment every two years.

To renew a physical therapist assistant license, you must have 24 hours of continuing education and 200 hours of physical therapy employment every two years.

Physical therapists and physical therapist assistants must have completed this requirement by their birth date every two years. The continuing education (CE) and employment hours must have been obtained during the preceding two years, from birth date to birth date. If you're reporting this year, any CE that was obtained before your birth date two years ago or after your current birth date, cannot be used to satisfy the continuing education or employment requirement. The expiration date for all credentials is the practitioner's birthday.

The board does not pre-approve continuing education courses for presenters or licensees. Licensed physical therapists and physical therapist assistants may only report continuing education courses that are specifically related to the practice of physical therapy. Continuing education courses must also have specified goals and objectives.

This board's CE requirements are listed in Legislative Rule §16-1-10 found within the Rules & Laws section. Per our CE guidelines, courses sponsored by the APTA, the WVPTA, BOC and any CAPTE accredited school are automatically approved by this board and are not required to be submitted for review.

If any of your CE courses are not WV Board approved, or you do not have enough CE hours, you will be in violation of the Physical Therapy Law for the State of WV. Please be advised that you must truthfully attest on your renewal request that your CE requirements, as stated in law have been fulfilled at the time of renewal.
